Glenmont Job Corps Academy offers hands-on training in the following careers:

life on center

Most of our students live on campus in one of our four dorms, and some live at home and commute daily for their education and career skills training. The 100-acre campus is a short distance from downtown Albany, N.Y.

Glenmont provides well-equipped classrooms and self-paced career skills training and academic programs in a safe environment, where a Zero Tolerance Policy for drugs and violence is strictly enforced.

Glenmont Job Corps Academy offers a variety of extracurricular activities including:

- ◆ Mentoring club
- ◆ Participation in activities like arts and crafts, talent shows or roller skating
- ◆ Sports like basketball, volleyball, softball and swimming
- ◆ Student Government Association
- ◆ Trips to movies, malls, concerts and other local outings

Glenmont also has a recreation hall and billiards room, weight room, aerobics room and an indoor swimming pool.

daily schedule

Glenmont students start the day at 6 a.m., and academic and career skills training ends at 3:30 p.m. Lights-out is at 11 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 2 a.m. on the weekends. Eligible students may request day or weekend passes. When the training day ends, and on many weekends, students participate in center-sponsored recreational activities such as athletics, billiards, dances and outings to restaurants, movies, malls and area cultural sites.

education

Glenmont's students can earn a GED or may qualify to participate in the online high school diploma program. After graduating from Job Corps, highly qualified students may enroll in Hudson Valley Community College as part of Job Corps' Advanced Career Training (ACT) program.

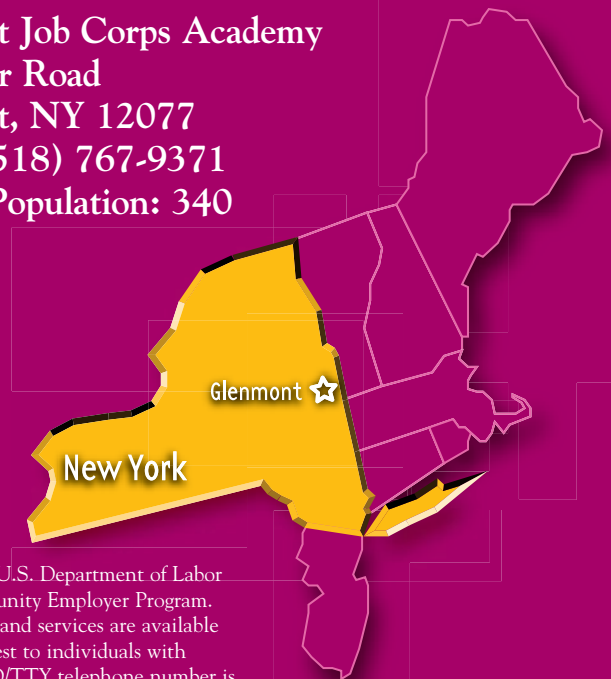
